


Burden of Righting Inequities?

Dentists who accept Medicaid/CHIP by race




Oral Health in the Community




It's a lot of systematic oppression where people of color and immigrants always end up, like she said, on the bottom of the totem pole. So...







... oftentimes, we're not getting access to the things we need because of that systematic oppression. It's in the system and we have to kind of change the system to get the opportunities that we need.







Obviously, we know they're educated, but I feel like they should educate themselves as to the community that they're going into...







... Learn about the people that you're going to be working with. Learn about all ethnicities or the diversity of the community you're going into. Because I think that plays a big part in anybody trusting a doctor or feeling comfortable with them, them being understanding of the people that they're going to be working with.







I had an African-American patient who said, I've been treated different ways, different places, and a lot of people think that Black people don't need as much anesthetic. And so, she said that, and she almost got a little bit upset when she was telling me about it.







I had an Amish patient in PEDS, who was 14. And I found my own bias creeping in there as well because that population usually has incredibly [inaudible] rates. And it was his first time in the dentist.









...Again, 14, so I was expecting like: "Oh, boy. Here we go." He had one cavity and a chipped tooth, and that was it. So, I mean, sometimes that you have to keep training yourself out of it every time it slips in, I guess.





...before I can even say, "oh, I'm born and raised in Maryland", I know she's insinuating what is my ethnic background.

She was like, "oh, you look Korean", which is, that's not offensive, but I'm not. I'm Chinese. And before, and then she just vaulted into "you look Korean because of your slanted eyes." And I was like, whoa, whoa.






...I was so caught off guard that I didn't know how to respond. I think she would identify as a white female, probably in the baby boomer generation.







Set My Heart to Five

In 2054, certain careers are now the purview of extremely human-like bots, including dentistry. Jared, a bot-dentist in Ypsilanti, Michigan, discovers one day that, unlike his bot brethren, he has emotions. Specifically, with the help of his friend a human medical doctor, Dr. Glundenstein, they determine he is depressed. To test out if Jared can experience other emotions, Dr. Glundenstein recommends that Jared go to see classic movies. These differ from more recent popular movies that all tend to deal with bots trying to dominate humans and take over the world. Jared soon discovers he indeed is feeling emotions and sets off on an epic journey to California to try to change humans' views on bots and help humans find their hearts again by writing a novel screenplay.

Although, the storyline of Jared being a dentist is not a central theme of the book, there are some excerpts at the beginning of the book (listed below) that could be used to spark discussion about the profession. Also, overall, the book has themes around technology and humans' relationship to it, hierarchies and forms of enslavement in society, storytelling, and the human condition.


